
******New Shop in Payson******



April 5, 2016: Tuesday, 10AM-2PM: Beginning Landscape by Barbara Janson. Location: In our Guild classroom. Learn quick and easy techniques as you create a small landscape quilt of scenic Arizona from one of Barb's original compositions. This class is perfect for the novice or experienced quilter to begin the journey into landscape quilting! Each student can pick from one of three different Arizona landscapes especially designed for beginners: a ranch, a desert scene or the Rim country. Barbara also provides each student with a color photo and a pattern. Each student finishes the day feeling comfortable and confident enough to finish the project at home. Most students will have enough time to fuse half of the small landscape. Some even start stitching. Class cost \$40 per student; min 6; max 12 students. April 6, 2016: Wednesday, 1-3PM: Thread Play Made Simple by Barbara Janson. Learn to create dimensional plants and animals with thread... just thread. Embellish your fiber art with Texture. See how easy it is to make trees, flowers, leaves and even cactus with a few basic free-motion techniques. A must-have class for landscape quilters. Hands-on instruction for each student. Thread play class is a technique class, there is no "finished project", just learning and gaining new free-motion skills. Class cost \$40 per student; min 6; max 12 students. 

****Quilt Room Tour****


The quilt room tour is scheduled for Jul 6, Weds.

*****Recipe Corner*****New Feature****

This month's featured recipe is Diane Williams' Bean Soup. Combined with Carol Spessard's Swedish Bread published last month, this soup is the perfect tummy warming combination for chilly Arizona evenings! So quilters write up your family's favorite and email the editor. Recipes will be on website in the Members Only Area. Need a recipe for April!

. Diane's Bean Soup w/ Rutabaga and Bok Choy (8 servings)

1 c. cooked navy beans or garbanzo beans 3/4 tsp dried crushed sage

4 c water

1/4 tsp pepper

1 veggie bouillon cube

1 pkg miso soup mix

clove garlic minced

2 c thinly sliced Bok Choy

1 leek thinly sliced

2 yellow turnips or rutabagas, peeled and cubed

1 - 14.5 oz can cut tomatoes

Combine beans, water, bouillon, miso soup mix, leek, sage, pepper. Simmer 20 mins. Add rutabaga; simmer 20 mins. Add Bok Choy and tomatoes. Simmer 10 mins. Serve with fresh bread.

Begin to "think like a painter" as Barb shares how to choose a natural palette and develop depth in a landscape quilt by using the seven-step value scale. This program will last 1.5 hrs. April 6, 2016: Barbara Janson presents Under African Skies: The influence of African-American History and Culture on the American Art Form of Quilting. REMINDER: 2016 HSQG Quilt Show Entry Rules and Definitions - **Rule #8:** <u>An entry WILL BE RE-JECTED if it is not clean and free of smoke odors and pet hair.</u> Be sure to pre-check your quilt with a lint roller or masking tape prior to bringing your quilt to check-in and make sure that it does not have ANY smoke odors
